# INTRODUCTION

Special Hunts are part of the Kansas Hunter Recruitment and Retention Program called “PASS IT ON.” This program addresses the need to recruit new hunters and retain existing hunters in order to ensure the future of hunting in Kansas.

Special Hunts offer high-quality hunting opportunities. The majority of hunts provide new opportunities on public areas traditionally closed to hunting. These hunts provide a less crowded experience with better harvest opportunities than normally associated with public wildlife areas. While providing excellent opportunities to introduce new hunters to the sport, special hunts have also proven popular with current hunters looking for better hunting. Persons with impaired abilities also find this program offers ideal opportunities to participate in hunting. Special hunts are not designed to provide a guaranteed limit and may not appeal to hunters who have already secured numerous good hunting opportunities, although they are open to everyone.

Some hunts are available to youth only while novice hunts allow youth and adults who have never hunted to participate. Both youth and novice hunts require adult mentors to supervise in the hunt. Mentors are allowed to hunt in Mentor-novice and Mentor-youth hunts. Make sure you understand the type of hunt

being offered before applying. If these hunts interest you, fill out an application. There are no application fees, but purchase of appropriate licenses, certificates, permits, and stamps is required.

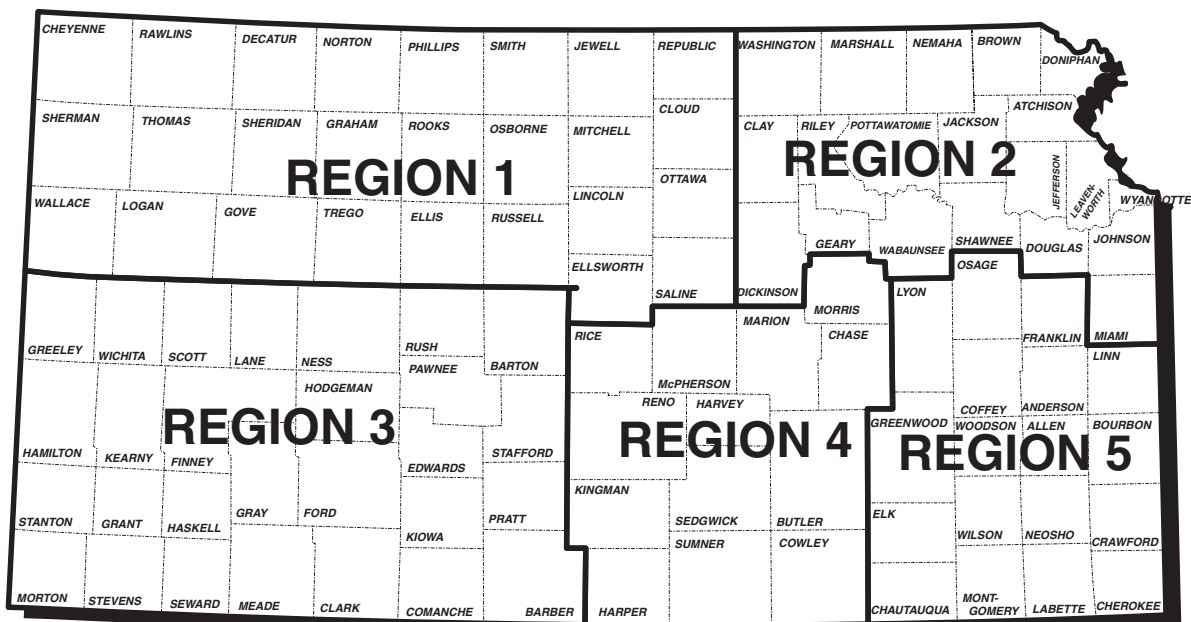

# INFORMATION

- **REVIEW THIS BROCHURE COMPLETELY** before online application.
- Hunts are grouped by administrative regions depicted on the previous page.
- Hunts are also grouped within each region into four **HUNT TYPES: UPLAND BIRD/DOVE, WATERFOWL (GEESE), WATERFOWL (DUCKS), AND DEER.**
- In each HUNT TYPE there are up to three **HUNT CATEGORIES: OPEN, YOUTH, or MENTOR.** Hunt categories for special deer hunts will also include letters A for archery only, M for muzzleloader only, F for firearms, and S for shotgun.
- **OPEN Hunts-** These hunts are available to all persons.
- **YOUTH Hunts-** These hunts require parties to contain at least one youth 18 or younger who must be accompanied by an adult 21 or older. (Some hunts may have more specific age requirements.) Adults may not hunt.
- **MENTOR Hunts-** Hunts open to both youth and novice hunters who are each supervised by a licensed adult 21 or older (mentor).
- A youth is a person 18 or younger.
- A mentor is an adult, 21 years or older, who supervises and/or participates in a hunt restricted to youth or novice hunters.
- A novice is a youth 18 years or younger or any person who has never possessed a hunting license. A one-time apprentice license is available if Hunter Education has not been completed. If Novice applicant is successful they must be accompanied by a licensed adult 21 or older.
- Anyone 16 or older must have completed a certified hunter education course to hunt. Non-Hunter education certified applicants may obtain a one-time deferral that allows the purchase of an apprentice license. The deferral is valid through the end of the calendar year.
- Special accommodations made for disabled hunters upon request. Disabled hunters must possess a valid Department of Motor Vehicle Individual Identification card.
- Locations and descriptions of specific hunts are found in the regional sections.
- Several hunts allow additional hunters to accompany a permittee.
- **NO-SHOWS** – Please make every effort to attend selected hunts.
- Special hunt permits provide only access. All appropriate licenses and permits are required.

## APPLICATION PROCESS AND INSTRUCTIONS

- One application per person per draw.
- Apply online at [kdwp.state.ks.us](http://kdwp.state.ks.us). If no internet access is available, application can be made over the phone by calling (620) 672-5911 Ask for Special Hunts.
- Successful applicants will be notified approximately 15 days after application deadline by email (by mail if applying over the phone).
- There will be two application deadlines and two draws, Draw 1 for hunts in September and October and Draw 2 for hunts in November, December, January, and February.
- Application for Draw 2 will not be available until successful applicants from Draw 1 are notified.
- Before starting an application, review the hunts and dates available in the brochure and become familiar with your choices (up to three per application).
- If applying for deer hunts that include more than one day, enter the first day of the hunt only.
- All hunts are listed on the HUNT CODE TABLE (Page 4 and 5) for easy reference. The HUNT CODES are the same for both draws.
- Record the chosen HUNT CODES and HUNT DATES from the HUNT CODE TABLE for application.
- If you have no date preference for that draw period, record the word “ANY” in the date area of the application. If “ANY” is selected as a hunt date, it will be filled with the first available open date within the draw the application was made for.
- Some season dates are not set during the application period, so only date estimates are listed in the Hunt Code Table. Hunt dates will be final when successful applicants are issued hunt permits.
- To assist in date selection, a **Sportsmen’s Calendar** is available in the back of this document.
- Random drawings in each hunt type will determine special hunt participants for each draw.
- Successful applicants for hunts in a state park will need state park vehicle entrance permits to enter the park.
- **UNSUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS WILL NOT RECEIVE A NOTICE.**
- Successful applicants must possess appropriate licenses, stamps, tags, and permits.
- The permit column on the Hunt Code Table indicates the number of permits allowed for each hunt date.
- The 1st choice column on the Hunt Code Table indicates the number of applicants who chose that hunt as a first choice the previous year or that it’s a new hunt.

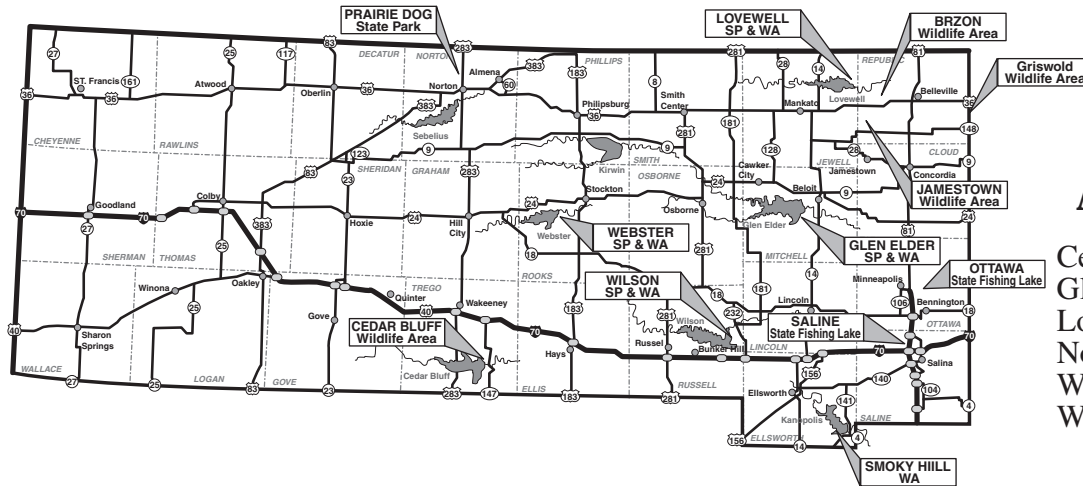

Help the future of our hunting heritage by serving as a Mentor and take a Novice hunting. Novices include youth 18 and younger and anyone, regardless of age, who has not hunted before. These are the perfect hunts to take a spouse, friend, or a relative that has never hunted before. Some Mentor Novice hunts become family outings with children, parents and friends. Mentors can also participate in hunting on these hunts.

## REGION 1

### UPLAND/DOVE HUNTS

Opportunities are primarily for pheasant, but some areas have quail also. These are 1/2-day hunts, from 1/2 hour before sunrise until noon on specified dates. The daily bag limits are reduced to 2 pheasants and 4 quail. Mentor hunts require at least one Novice (a youth 18 or younger or anyone who has not previously purchased a hunting license) for each licensed adult mentor. Both the mentor and novice can hunt.

#### Brzon Wildlife Area – Mentor-Novice

**Hunt Code: U01**

Located 8 miles north and 4 miles west of Belleville - 320 acres. One Mentor hunt permit will be issued for 6 Sundays during the upland bird season. Mentor hunts require at least one Novice (a youth 18 or younger or anyone who has not previously purchased a hunting license) for each licensed adult mentor. Three hunters may accompany the successful applicant for a total of four hunters per hunt.

Total permits – 6

#### Glen Elder State Park – Mentor-Novice

**Hunt Code: U02**

Located 1 mile west of Glen Elder - 800 acres. One Mentor hunt permit will be issued for 9 Sundays during upland bird season. Mentor hunts require at least one Novice (a youth 18 or younger or anyone who has not previously purchased a hunting license) for each licensed adult mentor. Five hunters may accompany the successful applicant for a total of six hunters per hunt.

Total permits – 9

#### Glen Elder Wildlife Area – Mentor-Novice

**Hunt Code: U03**

Located southwest and southeast of Cawker City - 700 acres. Two Mentor hunt permits will be issued for 9 Sundays during the upland bird season. Mentor hunts require at least one Novice (a youth 18 or younger or anyone who has not previously purchased a hunting license) for each licensed adult mentor. Five hunters may accompany the successful applicant for a total of six hunters per hunt.

Total permits – 18

#### Jamestown Wildlife Area – Mentor-Novice

**Hunt Code: U04**

Located 6 miles south of Courtland - 300 acres. One Mentor hunt permit will be issued for 6 Sundays during the upland bird season. Mentor hunts require at least one Novice (a youth 18 or younger or anyone who has not previously purchased a hunting license) for each licensed adult mentor. Three hunters may accompany the successful applicant for a total of four hunters per hunt.

Total permits – 6

#### Smoky Hill Wildlife Area – Mentor-Novice

**Hunt Code: U05**

Located 33 miles southwest of Salina - 400 acres. One Mentor hunt permit will be issued for 6 Sundays during the upland bird season. Mentor hunts require at least one Novice (a youth 18 or younger or anyone who has not previously purchased a hunting license) for each licensed adult mentor. Three hunters may accompany each successful applicant for a total of four hunters per hunt.

Total permits – 6

## **Wilson Wildlife Area – Mentor-Novice**

**Hunt Code: U06**

Located 8 miles north of Bunker Hill - 600 acres. One Mentor hunt permit will be issued for 6 Sundays during upland bird season. Mentor hunts require at least one Novice (a youth 18 or younger or anyone who has not previously purchased a hunting license) for each licensed adult mentor. Three hunters may accompany the successful applicants for a total of four hunters per hunt.

Total permits – 6

## **WATERFOWL HUNTS**

Due to waterfowl season dates and zone boundaries being approved after the Special Hunt deadline, exact hunt dates may need modification after the drawing. Successful applicants will be notified of exact dates. All successful applicants must have appropriate hunting license, state and/or federal waterfowl stamps and HIP permit as required by regulations, in addition to the Special Hunt Permit to participate.

## **GOOSE HUNTS**

Opportunities are primarily for Canada geese, but other waterfowl in season may also be taken. Mentor hunts require at least one Novice (a youth 18 or younger or anyone who has not previously purchased a hunting license) for each licensed adult mentor. Both the mentor and novice can hunt.

Pit blinds and other blind options are provided in feed fields on the perimeter of refuges. Permits are issued for morning hunts during the dark goose season. Three hunters may accompany the successful applicant. Shooting hours are from 1/2hour before sunrise until noon, with a 10 shot shell limit per hunter. Limited Goose decoys are available for some hunts.

All hunters must have the appropriate Deer permit or their first purchased whitetail antlerless only permit that is valid statewide on all lands. Hunters will be allowed to utilize any legal deer tags for these hunts.

**Hunt Code D38**

Located 2 miles northeast of Atchison - 2,245 acres. Five youth hunt can participate in this hunt permits will be issued for the special youth deer season. All hunters must have the appropriate deer permit or their first purchased whitetail antlerless only permit that is valid statewide on all lands. 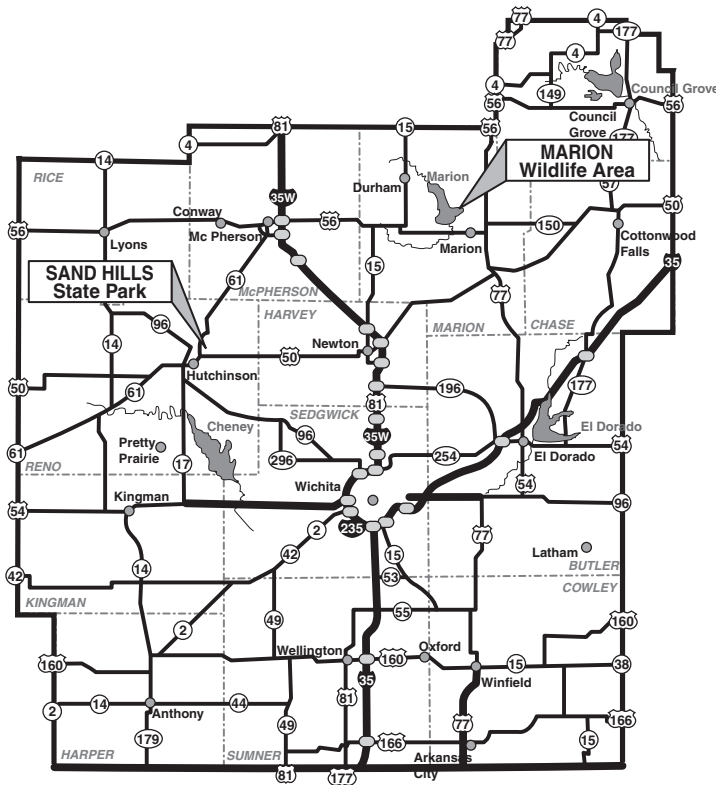

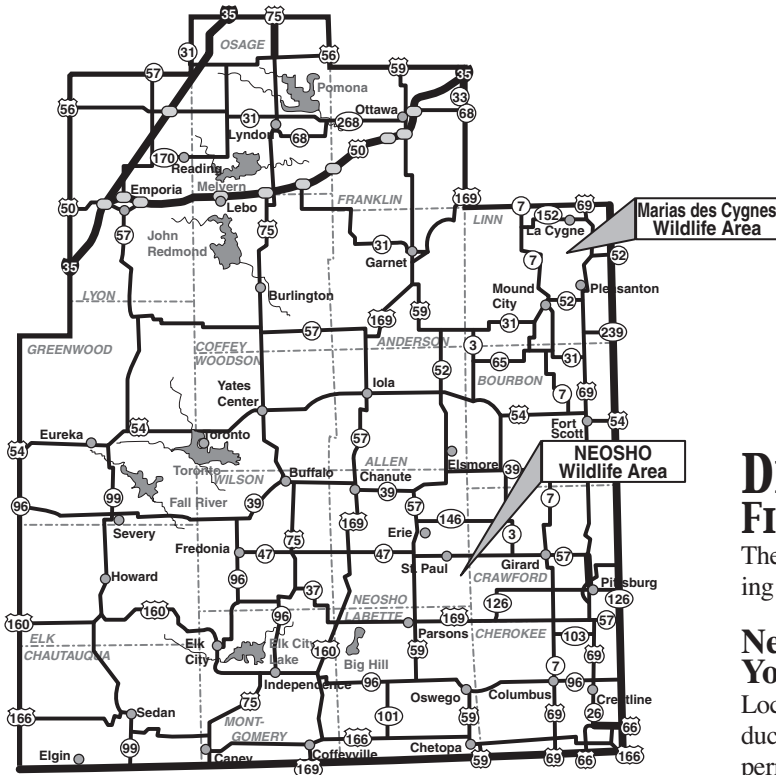

The special hunt permit only allows access and provides no hunting licenses or permits

### Neosho Wildlife Area – Youth

**Hunt Code D45**

Located 1 mile east of St. Paul - 200 acres. This hunt will be conducted on the refuge portion of the wildlife area. Two youth hunt permits will be issued for the youth deer season, only youth that are 16 years of age or younger can participate in this hunt. Two youth (18 years of age or younger) hunt permits for the second weekend of the firearms deer season and two youth (18 years of age or younger) permits for the January antlerless season.

Participating youth hunters must hunt with the immediate supervision of an adult 21 years old or older. One antlered and one antlerless deer may be harvested by the youth with valid deer permits. The supervising adult may not hunt. Blind or stand locations will be assigned each day.

Total permits – 6

### Marais des Cygnes WA – Mentor-Youth

**Hunt Code D46**

Located 6 miles north of Pleasanton – 950 acres. This youth hunt will be conducted on the refuge portion of the wildlife area. Five youth hunt permits for the first weekend and five youth hunts for the second weekend of firearms season. Youth hunters must hunt with the immediate supervision of an adult 21 years old or older. One antlered and one antlerless deer maybe harvested by the youth with a valid deer permit.. Supervising adult may harvest only antlerless deer with valid deer permit. Blind or stand locations will be assigned each day.

### Linn Co. Park at LaCygne Lake – Mentor-Youth (Shotgun/Muzzleldr)

**Hunt Code D47**

Located 6 miles north of Pleasanton-400 acres. Five youth/mentor access permits will be issued for the extended January season. Equipment is restricted to shotgun slugs and muzzleloader. Participating hunters who are 12-16 years old must hunt with the immediate supervision of an adult 21 years old or older. The supervising adult may hunt. All hunters must have the appropriate valid deer permit.

Total Permit – 5

## WATERFOWL HUNTS

All hunters must have appropriate license, state and/or federal waterfowl stamps and HIP permit if required by regulations

## DUCK HUNTS

Opportunities are primarily for ducks, but other waterfowl in season may also be harvested. Permits are issued for morning hunts during the late zone waterfowl season. **THREE HUNTERS MAY ACCOMPANY THE SUCCESSFUL APPLICANT.** Shooting hours are from 1/2hour before sunrise until noon. Hunters must have means of bird retrieval (dog), especially on reservoirs where deeper water will be present. Blinds must be temporary and removed at the end of the hunt

### Neosho Wildlife Area – Mentor-Novice

**Hunt Code W21**

One hunt permit will be issued for the last Sunday of the 1st segment of the Late Zone - Hunt will be in refuge area. Only 3 hunters will be allowed, no more than 2 adults. Special restrictions will apply to for this hunt. Contact Monte Manbeck at (620) 449-2539 for more information. Hunt is walk-in access only and may last no longer than 4 hours. No boat allowed. Each hunter has a 12-shell limit. KDWP staff will be present and can supply decoys and a boat if needed. KDWP has youth model shotguns if needed. The hunt will be rescheduled in case of bad weather (ice).

## ARCHERY

The special hunt permit only allows access and provides no hunting licenses or permits

### Marais des Cygnes NWR – Open

*Hunt Code D48*

Participating hunters who are 12-16 years old must hunt under the immediate supervision of an adult 21 years old or older. Hunters may utilize any legal deer permits for these hunts. Supervising adult may not hunt unless they received an access permit.

*Hunt Code D49*

Located 6 miles north of Pleasanton - 800 acres. Thirty access permits will be issued for the archery season. Fifteen will be issued to Linn county residents. An antlerless deer must be harvested prior to taking an antlered. All hunters must have the appropriate deer permits.

Resident youth 16 years old and all nonresident youth must have a hunting license unless exempt by law, as well as a valid deer permit, and youth must be accompanied by an adult 18 or older. All resident and nonresident permits are valid in this season, and all permit, unit, and equipment restrictions apply, including hunter orange clothing. The adult may NOT hunt.

### Muzzleloader-only

Season—Sept. 21 - Oct. 4  
Daily bag limit/poss. — 1 per permit

### Archery

Season—Sept. 21 - Dec. 31  
Daily bag limit/poss. — 1 per permit

### Regular Firearms

Season—Dec. 2-13  
Daily bag limit/poss. — 1 per permit

### Extended Antlerless White-tailed Only

Season—Jan. 1-10, 2010

### Prairie Chicken (*early, east of 281 hwy*)

Daily bag limit — 2, possession — 4

Season — Nov. 21 - Jan. 31, 2010  
Daily bag limit — 2, possession — 4

### Prairie Chicken (*southwest*)

Season — Nov. 21 - Dec. 31  
Daily bag limit — 1, possession — 2

### Pheasant (cocks)

Season — Nov. 14 - Jan. 31, 2010  
Daily bag limit — 4, possession — 16

### Quail

Season — Nov. 14 - Jan. 31, 2010  
Daily bag limit — 8, possession — 32

### Special Youth (Statewide)

Season — Nov. 7-8  
Bag limit — Quail-4, Cock Pheasants-2  
Youth 16 and younger may hunt under the supervision of an adult 18 or older. The supervising adult may NOT hunt. Daily bag limits are half the regular season limits.

## Waterfowl

Due to waterfowl season dates and zone boundaries being approved after the Special Hunt deadline, the following changes may be made. Waterfowl special hunts dates may conflict with actual season dates. Applicants need to be aware that if a hunt date falls outside of the actual seasons date, adjustments will be made to the hunt. Successful applicants will be notified after the season dates have been approved.
